## **General Tips to Recovery:**

- Report damages to Pinellas County at Pinellas.Gov/Emergency-Information
- Keep power off after flooding until an electrician can take a look
- Contact your Insurance Company
- Tarp damaged roof to prevent further damage
- Extensively photograph all damaged items, furnishings, household materials prior to disposal
- Reach out to FEMA for additional aid and recovery

### **TRASH & DEBRIS:**

**City garbage, recycling, and bagged/containerized tree debris collection** is operating on your regular schedule.

If **missing trash/recycling containers**, place food waste and recyclables in white kitchen bags in separate piles for easy identification until replacements are available.

For **flooded properties**, place household items and tree/yard debris in separate curbside piles. FEMA will assess and bring contractors for flood debris collection—details to come.

Keep **yard/household debris off the street** to avoid blocking trucks or first responders.
